Dear Christian friends,

It may be difficult to imagine what it would mean to experience an earthquake, instantly losing a home, family members and friends, and life ceasing to exist as we have known it. The people of Haiti now know. Most Americans have been glued to the news accounts of the search and rescue efforts and all that encompasses such a widespread tragedy. As you know, here at Frontline Ministries we primarily focus on urging Christians to give their children a Christian education, so two years ago, we raised funds for a Christian school in Colombia, South America. Now we would like to help a Christian school minister the love of Christ in Haiti and we know of a true, heart-warming story about a Christian school there being used by the Lord in the aftermath of the earthquake.

Quisqueya (Kiss-kay-uh) Christian School (QCS), located in Port-au-Prince, is a K-12 school established over 40 years ago. On January 12, most of its 100+ students had just been dismissed for the day when the earthquake hit. Most of the students – some missionary children, some from the local embassies, and some local Haitian children – had left to go home. God in His wonderful grace and mercy spared the QCS buildings from collapsing, one of the few undamaged facilities in the area. All the teachers and staff and their families survived, but two elementary students lost their lives, and several parents of students did not survive. (The principal of the Christian school where Gail formerly taught was on staff at QCS in past years, so this information is current.)

The school is officially closed for now, as the campus is being used for relief efforts. The chapel serves as a surgery facility; the pre-K/K playground is occupied by children from a nearby orphanage that was severely damaged; several national workers and their families now homeless are living in tents on the campus; the basketball court/soccer field is being used for emergency relief aid by CRI; and the Army is using the school's facilities. Although quite a daunting task, God is equipping and strengthening the teachers and staff as they minister to those in need in the name of Jesus. Although QCS has become a place of refuge, a "hub" for their community, they need to be able to provide relief long-term, not just in the immediate crisis.

QCS is sending "Home School" packages home for each student so they can keep up with their studies. They are trusting God in everything. *Our appeal is simple:* If you feel led to help Quisqueya Christian School in their relief efforts, please, send your donation to Frontline Ministries, Inc., or go to our website at [www.exodusmandate.org](http://www.exodusmandate.org) to make a donation online, so together we can minister to the children, teachers, staff and national workers and their families. ***God has ordained Quisqueya Christian School for such a time as this.
